SCHOOL COMMITTEE NEWS Superintendent Search Update

On Wednesday, December 10, at its meeting scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in the Board of Selectmen's Meeting Room, the Lexington School Committee will announce the finalists for the Superintendent of Schools position.

The finalists will be touring Lexington individually during the week of December 15-18. An informal community reception open to the public with each of the finalists will be held in the Library Media Center, first floor of the main building, at Lexington High School from 2:30-3:30 PM on Monday, December 15; Wednesday, December 17; and Thursday, December 18. This will be an opportunity for community members to meet the finalists.

Following a day-long visit to the district, each of the finalist candidates will be interviewed by the School Committee in open session at 7:00 PM in the Central Office, 146 Maple Street, on December 15, 17, and 18. These meetings will be recorded by LexMedia for future broadcast.

The School Committee will meet in open session on Friday, December 19, at 4:00 PM in the Board of Selectmen's Meeting Room to select its preferred candidate for Superintendent. This meeting will be broadcast live.
