
TextEdit: What is it?!?

What is it? TextEdit is the basic word processor included for free within the Mac OS

What features does it have?

- Basic formatting including:
 - Spacing: single or double
 - o Alignment
 - o Bullets and lists
 - o Styles including bold, underline, italics, strikeout, etc...
 - o Fonts
 - Text color
- <u>Spell check</u>: To access this feature, simply right-click (or control-click) over the misspelled word. The spelling suggestions will be at the top of the right-click menu. This program does not "run" a spell check like Microsoft Word.
- Access to a dictionary: To look up a word in the dictionary, simply right-click (or control-click) over the word. Click on "look up in dictionary". This will open the Dictionary application of the Mac OS.
- <u>Find</u>: Located keywords within the text by pressing "command F" or going to Edit Find.
- "<u>Transformation</u>": This feature is found within the Edit menu. It allows you to quickly make uppercase, make lowercase, or capitalize words or phrases.
- <u>Word completion</u>: To access this feature, begin typing a word then press "escape". This will drop down a word completion menu:



You can then select from this menu by using the mouse or arrow keys.

- <u>Text to speech</u>: Read text aloud with built-in text to speech feature (using the designated key combination). First highlight the text using the text tool within the main toolbar
- <u>Zoom</u>: Zoom all text by highlighting the text, the press "command +". To zoom out, press "command -".
