 7. Pupil capacities are calculated for the general classroom and kindergarten count at each school (excluding swing CR's) based on the following policy for optimum class size at each grade:

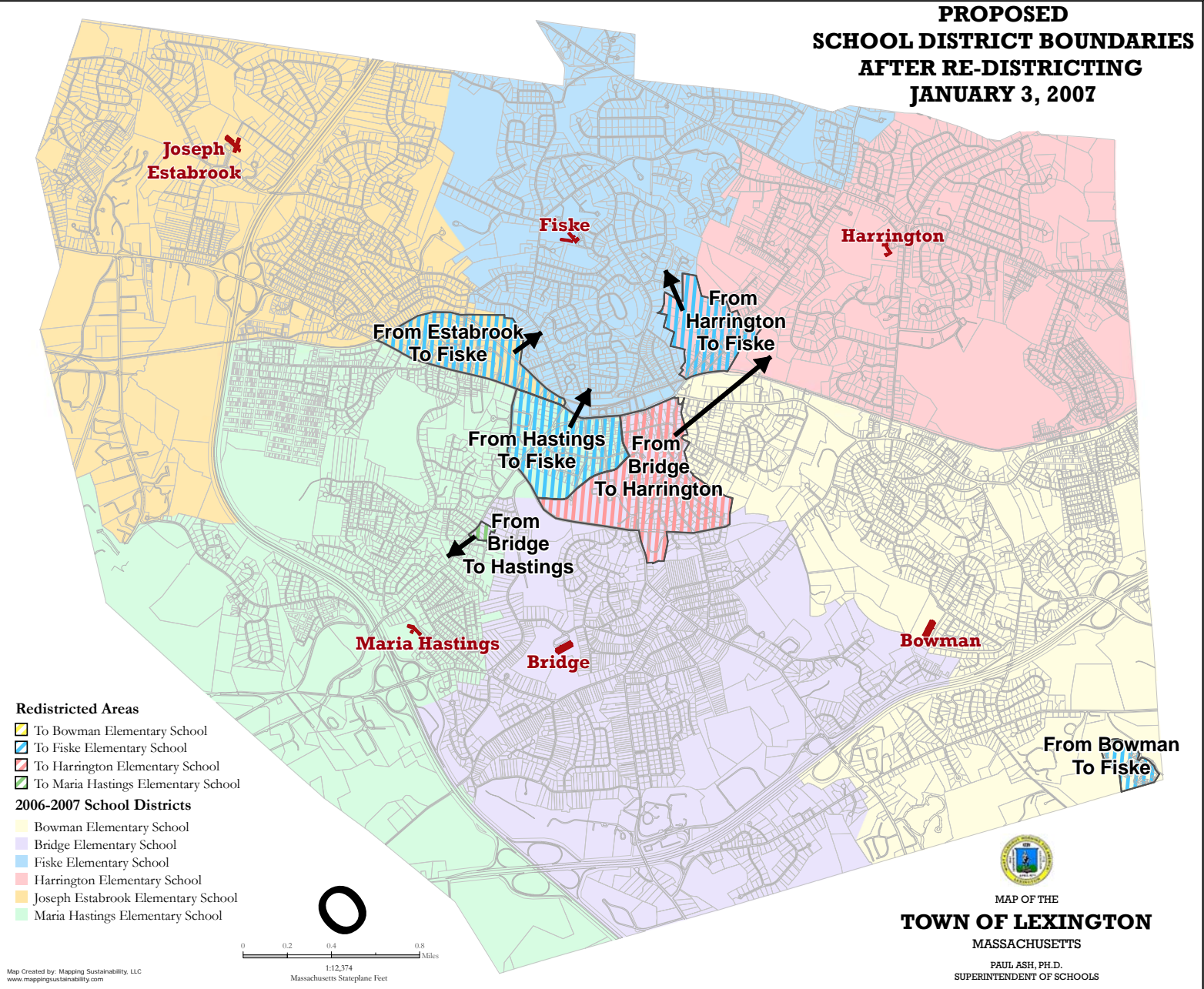

Frequently Asked Questions

Q1. When will children attend new schools, if redistricted?

A1. September 2007

Q2. Will my current 4th grade student be allowed to stay at his/her K-5 school if we live in a redistricted area?

A2. Yes. If you decide to keep your child in his/her current school, please understand that the school system will not provide transportation (please see Q4 regarding middle schools).

Q3. Will my current 4th grade student be allowed to stay at his/her K-5 school if we live in another school district?

A3. Yes. If you decide to keep your child in his/her current school, please understand that the school system will not provide transportation. In 2008-2009, your child will attend the middle school based on your address, not your child's current elementary school.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q4. If I decide to keep my current 4th grade child at Harrington, instead of attending Fiske next year, may I send him/her to Clarke Middle School in 2008-2009?

A4. No. Harrington School students whose geographic area is redistricted to Fiske must attend Diamond Middle School in 2008-2009. Transfers between middle schools are not allowed.

Q5. Which middle school will my current Harrington 5th grade child attend, if we live in a redistricted area?

A5. If your geographic area is redistricted from Harrington to Fiske, then your 5th grade student will be provided the option of attending Clarke or Diamond Middle Schools. Please note that younger siblings who live in the redistricted area will attend Diamond Middle School.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q6. What if redistricting means I will have children assigned to two middle schools, may I send them both to the same school?

A6. Yes. In such rare cases, parents may choose which middle school their children will attend and transportation will be available (normal user fees still apply).

Q7. If I live in a redistricted area, will current K-3 students be permitted to stay in their current school?


A7. Maybe. Parents will need to apply to central office to keep their child in his/her current school. Applications will be available in April and applications will only be approved on a space available basis. LPS will have clearly defined criteria for making the approval process fair and unbiased in case of too many applications for available spots.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q8. If my child currently attends a school in another Lexington school district, may my child stay at his/her current school?

A8. Maybe, Parents will need to apply to central office to keep their child in his/her current school. Applications will be available in April and applications will only be approved on a space available basis. Children with special needs who attend a school designed to meet their special needs will stay at their current school.
